SWAN BROTHERS SEASON UPDATE

It's been a challenging and unpredictable start to the year for Swan Brothers. Our spreading operations have initially been slow, running at only 30% capacity until early June, with some weeks covering only 500 hectares and others jumping to over 5,000 hectares.

Despite the rocky start to the season, the team has now spread an impressive 42,000 hectares so far this year, including 15,000 hectares in the past 3.5 weeks alone.

On the trucking side of things, Scotty began the year on a long interstate trucking run, but we are glad to have him back in the region, providing his usual high quality fertiliser deliveries.

After a long, dry summer, the Coorong region has finally received a decent and widespread break, followed by scatted rainfall across most of the region.



However, the season has been late to start and combined with a statewide delay in committing to Urea tonnes, supply is expected to be tight. Ongoing conflict in the Middle East has only added to these challenges.

As we push ahead, we ask everyone to spare a thought for the farmers, particularly in the Mallee, who continue to face extremely tough conditions due to limited rainfall.

As we move into the winter months, the regional South Australian property market continues to show resilience, with steady interest across both residential and rural sectors. Here's what we're seeing in the Coorong and Murraylands for June and July:

MARKET SNAPSHOT

Buyer Demand:

There is sustained buyer activity from both locals and out-of-town purchasers looking for lifestyle change, affordable acreage, and investment opportunities. Properties in towns such as Tailem Bend, Meningie, Murray Bridge, Coonalpyn and Tintinara continue to attract attention, particularly well-presented homes and income-producing rural land.

Stock Levels:

Listings remain tight, with many vendors choosing to delay sales until spring. This is keeping upward pressure on prices, particularly for entry-level homes and lifestyle properties under \$500,000. If you're thinking of selling, now is an ideal time to beat the spring rush.

Rental Market:

The rental market remains under pressure, with high demand and low vacancy rates. Well-maintained 3-bedroom homes are leasing quickly, often with multiple applicants. Weekly rents have edged up in due to strong demand.

Tailem Bend: Continued growth linked to activity at The Bend Motorsport Park and strong local employment. Demand for investment properties remains strong.

Meningie: Lakefront and lifestyle properties are drawing increased interest from retirees and work-from-home buyers. Water views remain a premium.


Murray Bridge: Strong infrastructure investment and population growth are driving demand in both residential and industrial sectors.

The past month has seen a noticeable increase in civil construction activity across the Coorong and surrounding regions, with higher demand for roadworks, driveway construction, and shed pad development.

Swan Earthmovers continues to supply high-quality materials to support this demand, with ample stock of DIT Specification PM2-20mm material currently available at Chapman's Pit. Our team is remaining productive Chapmans Pit to ensure consistent availability of product for bulk orders, local contractors, and ongoing projects.

Expressions of Interest (EOIs) for tenders have also seen a marked increase as businesses and councils finalise works programs in line with end-of-financial-year planning.

Our long-standing council contracts have delivered a stable workload over the past three months, particularly through on-site pit crushing operations. These partnerships continue to support regional infrastructure upgrades.




Pugmill service enquiries have also risen steadily, driven by the need for moisture-conditioned materials and the incorporation of stabilisers to meet specification requirements.

PROJECT UPDATES

ROAD TRACK CONSTRUCTION AND CRUSHING

Swan Earthmovers recently completed a 3.4-kilometre track construction project, showcasing our heavy machinery capabilities alongside on-site material crushing.

To construct the new tracks, the crew crushed oversized rubble sourced directly from the farm's pit.

The project utilised key crushing equipment including the Pegson Jaw Crusher, PC450 excavator, and D10 dozer. Additional machinery such as belly dumpers, loaders, rollers, and graders were used to shape and compact the tracks.

This operation highlights our commitment to delivering high-quality earthmoving and crushing services, tailored to meet the unique needs of each client.

CRUSHING AT BRINKWORTHS

Swan Earthmovers has also been hard at work crushing approximately 20,000 tonnes of 40mm rubble at Brinkworth's farm near Millicent, with just a small amount left to complete.

On site, Cody has been learning the ropes under the guidance of experienced operator Graham, gaining valuable hands-on crushing experience.

Meanwhile, Kelly, one of our newest team members, has been picking things up fast, now operating the D10 Dozer.


